Bill Topic: FIRST-GENERATION-SERVING HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS

The bill requires the Department of Higher Education to identify first-generation-serving institutions of higher education. The bill increases state workload on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill defines "first-generation-serving institution" as an institution of higher education that has either:

- an average resident, first-generation, undergraduate student population share for the most recent year for which data is available and the two prior years that equals or exceeds the Fall 2022 statewide average resident, first-generation, undergraduate population; or
• obtained a First Scholars Network of Institutions designation from the Center for First-Generation Student Success, or a similar third-party designation.

The Colorado Department of Higher Education (DHE) is required to annually identify these institutions, notify qualifying institutions and the General Assembly, and post those institutions on its website.

State Expenditures

The bill minimally increases workload for DHE to identify qualifying institutions, post the institutions online, and notify the institutions and the General Assembly. Institutions of higher education already submit data on first-generation students to the department. No change in appropriations for either is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
