Summary of Legislation

Subject to limited exceptions, the bill allows a named victim of sexual assault or victim's designee to receive unredacted criminal records.

In cases where a child was a victim of or witness to a criminal offense, the bill allows the Office of the State Public Defender and the Office of the Alternate Defense Counsel to receive the unredacted criminal records. The bill also clarifies that changes to redactions in child victim and witness records passed in <u>Senate Bill 23-075</u> applies offenses committed on or after January 1, 2024.

State Expenditures

The bill streamlines the record review process for the Office of the State Public Defender and the Alternate Defense Counsel, eliminating the need for trial court assistance. This workload offset is expected to be minimal and no change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
