	The bill expands the community investment grant under the Behavioral Health Administration. The bill increases state workload and potentially costs beginning in FY 2024-25.

Summary of Legislation

The bill expands the scope of the Behavioral Health-Care Continuum Gap Grant Program to include awarding a community investment grant for a new capital construction project.

State Expenditures

Beginning in FY 2024-25, workload in the Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) will increase to review any capital construction grant requests received under the expand program. This work can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Should the General Assembly, at its discretion, choose to appropriate additional funding to the BHA for the Behavioral Health-Care Continuum Gap Grant Program, costs will increase. However, the fiscal note assumes that additional funding is not mandatory solely from creating a new purpose for which grant awards from an existing grant program may be used. The General Assembly may choose to appropriate additional funding in this bill or through the Long Bill to fund additional grants. For informational purposes, the BHA has requested an \$8 million placeholder in the FY 2024-25 budget for capital construction grants through the Behavioral Health-Care Continuum Gap Grant Program if this bill is enacted.

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Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
