Summary of Fiscal Impact:	□ State Revenue State Transfer □ Local Government State Expenditure TABOR Refund □ Statutory Public Entity In the current fiscal year, the bill transfers \$4 million to the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund, decreases the General Fund appropriation to the Community Crime Victims Services Grant Program, and appropriates \$1 million to the program from the cash fund, among other changes. In the current FY 2023-24, the bill decreases state expenditures and transfers \$4 million.				
Appropriation Summary:	For FY 2024-25, the bill includes a net appropriation reduction of \$3 million from the Department of Public Health and Environment.				
Fiscal Note Status:	The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill, which was recommended by the Joint Budget Committee as part of the FY 2023-24 supplemental budget package.

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### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill exempts the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund in the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) from the cash fund reserve requirement, subjects the fund to annual appropriations instead of making appropriations continuous, and transfers \$4 million to the fund from the General Fund in the current FY 2023-24. The bill also decreases the General Fund appropriation to the Community Crime Victims Services Grant Program made in the current FY 2023-24 by \$4 million and appropriates \$1 million to the program from the cash fund.

#### Background

In the FY 2023-24 Long Bill, the General Assembly appropriated \$4 million from the General Fund to the Community Crime Victims Grant Program. According to a Joint Budget Committee Staff's briefing, this bill clarifies that program funding is meant to be expended over multiple fiscal years.

#### **State Transfers**

In the current FY 2023-24 only, the bill transfers \$4 million from the General Fund to the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund within the CDPHE.

#### **State Expenditures**

In the current FY 2023-24, state expenditures will decrease by a total of \$3 million. This includes decreasing General Fund expenditures by \$4 million and increasing expenditures in the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund by \$1 million. Starting in FY 2024-25, expenditures in the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund may increase to spend the remaining \$3 million transferred to the cash fund; however, the timing of expenditures will be determined by the General Assembly.

#### **Other Budget Impacts**

**General Fund reserve.** Under current law, an amount equal to 15 percent of General Fund appropriations must be set aside in the General Fund statutory reserve. Based on this fiscal note, the bill is expected to decrease the amount of General Fund held in reserve by the amounts shown in Table 1, increasing the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

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#### **State Appropriations**

For the current FY 2023-24, the bill includes the following appropriations to the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment:

- a reduction in General Fund appropriations of \$4 million to the Community Crime Victims Grant Program; and
- an appropriation of \$1 million from the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund to the department, of which any unspent money is further appropriated in FY 2024-25.
