Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that decreases the Community Crime Victims Grant Program General Fund appropriation by \$4.0 million in FY 2023-24, and increases the program's cash fund appropriation by \$1.0 million from the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund in FY 2023-24. Additionally, the provision extends the authority of the Department to expend the cash fund appropriation through FY 2024-25.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a supplemental budget package for FY 2023-24. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2023-24 supplemental budget package a reduction of \$4.0 million General Fund. Additionally, the \$4.0 million General Fund transfer to the Community Crime Victims Cash Fund for FY 2023-24 included in this bill will reduce the General Fund reserve that is carried forward into FY 2024-25 by the same amount. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2023-24 supplemental budget package the General Fund revenue decrease that would result from the passage of this bill.
