Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of

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\$230,739 General Fund to the Behavioral Health Administration in the Department of Human Services for FY 2024-25. Of that amount, \$147,223 is further appropriated to the Department of Law. The provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Human Services will require an additional 0.9 FTE and the Department of Law will require an additional 0.6 FTE.

L.004 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.004** (attached) removes the section of the bill related to a universal behavioral health consent form, adds specifications to the friends and family input form, removes a provision that knowingly providing false information on the form be punishable by fine, and specifies that the Behavioral Health Administration promulgate rules to behavioral health safety net providers. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that the amendment reduces the appropriation required to \$50,604 General Fund in FY 2024-25.

Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$50,604 General Fund to the Behavioral Health Administration in the Department of Human Services in FY 2024-25 to align with **L.004**. Of that amount, \$32,005 is further appropriated to the Department of Law. The provision also states that the provision is based on the assumption that the Department of Human Services will require an additional 0.2 FTE and the Department of Law will require an additional 0.1 FTE.

If the Committee adopts L.004, it should adopt J.002 and not J.001.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$230,739 for FY 2024-25, or \$50,604 if the Committee adopts **L.004**, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.
