Summary of Legislation

Under current law, a court cannot impose a monetary condition of bond for a traffic offense, petty offense, or a comparable municipal offense. However, a monetary condition of bond can be required if the comparable municipal offense is a property crime that would be a petty offense under state law and the loss is more than \$50. This bill aligns the property loss amount with the amount that would equate to a petty offense property crime under state law, which is \$300.

State Expenditures

In FY 2024-25 only, workload to the trial courts will increase to update bond schedules. This work can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Local Government

To the extent that more individuals are released on bond instead of being held in jail, costs to jails will decrease. The fiscal note assumes that the number of individuals being kept in jail for comparable municipal offenses of petty offense property crimes between \$50 and \$300 is minimal.
