#### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates \$5,538,925 cash funds to the Department of Labor and Employment and reduces appropriations by \$6,204,560 cash funds to the Department of Personnel for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Labor and Employment will require an additional 6.0 FTE and

the Department of Personnel will see a reduction of 2.0 FTE.
