Summary of Legislation

The bill transfers \$120,000 from the Unused State-Owned Real Property Cash Fund in the Department of Personnel and Administration (DPA) to the General Fund on July 1, 2024.

The Unused State-Owned Real Property Cash Fund, created under HB 21-1274, consists of proceeds from the sale, rent, or lease of unused, state-owned, real property. DPA may use the fund to conduct appraisals, surveys, and property improvements to determine if property is suitable for the construction of affordable housing, child care, public schools, residential mental and behavioral health care, or renewable energy facilities.

State Transfers

The bill transfers \$120,000 from the Unused State-Owned Real Property Cash Fund to the General Fund in FY 2024-25.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
