Starting in FY 2024-25, the bill increases state workload. No appropriation is required. **Appropriation Summary:** This final fiscal note reflects the enacted bill. The bill was recommended by the Joint **Fiscal Note** Status: Technology Committee.

### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill increases membership to the Artificial Intelligence Impact Task Force (which is renamed from the Facial Recognition Task Force) from 15 to 26 members and requires the task force to study and make recommendations on artificial intelligence and its potential impacts.

### **State Expenditures**

Starting in FY 2024-25, workload will increase to appoint new members. Changes to the task force and its scope of inquiry are not expected to significantly affect workload for Legislative Council Staff and the Office of Legislative Legal Services, which currently provide staff support to the task force in its current form.

#### **Effective Date**

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 6, 2024.
