The bill changes the membership and charge of the Biometric Technology and Artificial Intelligence Policy Task Force. Starting in FY 2024-25, the bill increases state workload.

Appropriation Summary:	No appropriation is required.
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Fiscal Note Status:	The revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill. The bill was recommended by the Joint Technology Committee.
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Summary of Legislation

The bill changes membership to the Biometric Technology and Artificial Intelligence Policy Task Force (which is renamed from the Facial Recognition Task Force) by:

- removing the Colorado Bureau of Investigation director;
- adding three members, including two experts on artificial intelligence, social media, and safety and privacy and one member who represents communities that have experienced discrimination by artificial intelligence and facial recognition technologies;
- requiring the task force to study artificial intelligence and biometric technology; and
- acknowledging that facial recognition services, artificial intelligence technology, and biometric technology exhibit bias against vulnerable communities.

State Expenditures

Starting in FY 2024-25, workload will increase to appoint new members. Changes to the task force and its scope of inquiry are not expected to significantly affect workload for Legislative Council Staff and the Office of Legislative Legal Services, which currently provide staff support to the task force in its current form.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
