### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill neither requires nor contains an appropriation clause for FY 2024-25.

### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**L.004** Bill Sponsor amendment **L.004** (attached) eliminates from the bill provisions that would require state funding to be appropriated to support the wages of assistant district attorneys. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that adopting amendment **L.004** would reduce the estimated General Fund appropriation required in FY 2026-27 from nearly \$3.8 million to \$1,539,446, which amount represents the state share of just the district attorney salary portion of the bill.

# **Points to Consider**

## Future Fiscal Impact

Although this bill would not require a General Fund appropriation for FY 2024-25, it is projected to require General Fund appropriations of \$3.8 million in FY 2026-27. If amendment **L.004** is adopted, the bill is projected to require General Fund Appropriations of \$1,539,446 in FY 2026-27.
