#### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

## **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$448,520 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.4 FTE.

#### L.005 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.005** (attached) states the General Assembly shall appropriate \$200,000 for the program, and that administrative costs of the program shall not exceed 8.0 percent of this amount. **J.002** (attached) adds a provision appropriating a total of \$200,000 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.1 FTE.

## If the Committee adopts <u>L.005</u>, it should adopt <u>J.002</u> and should NOT adopt <u>J.001</u>.

#### **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

If **L.005** is adopted, this bill will require a General Fund appropriation of \$200,000 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.
