## **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

## **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$123,900 General Fund to the Legislative Department for FY 2024-25.

**L.005** Bill Sponsor amendment **L.005** (attached) removes requirements for the Office of the State Auditor to identify and implement new methods of data collection for various state audits and evaluations that currently involve nonprofit member-specific data. This eliminates the appropriation required to perform this work and thus the fiscal impact of the bill.

The Committee may adopt either amendment J.001 or amendment L.005, but it should not adopt both.

## **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$63.1 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$9.5 million).

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$123,900 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$63.1 million set aside by the same amount.

Adopting amendment L.005 eliminates this General Fund impact.
