## **Summary of Legislation**

The bill allows authorized facilities, such as a fire station, hospital, or community clinic emergency center, where a parent may relinquish a newborn to install newborn safety devices. This type of device is typically a climate-controlled and electronically-monitored incubator built into a wall on the premises of the facility where an infant can be placed. The bill outlines the requirements for facilities and persons operating the safety devices.

#### **Local Government**

If a local government has installed, or is considering of installing a newborn safety device, costs may increase to ensure that the device meets the requirements of the bill. Any impact will depend on local decisions to install the devices in authorized facilities.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
