Summary of Fiscal Impact:	<b>No fiscal impact.</b> The bill makes technical changes to statutes related to labor and employment without substantive changes in policy or practice. The bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.		
Appropriation Summary:	No appropriation is required.		
Fiscal Note Status:	The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill, which is recommended by the Statutory Revision Committee.		

### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill makes technical changes to statute without substantive changes to policy or practice. Notably, this bill removes obsolete statutory references, removes unnecessary language to clarify the allowable use of grant funding from the Immigration Legal Defense Fund, and corrects inconsistencies regarding the membership of two committees: the apprentice committee for building and construction trades, and the apprentice committee for new and emerging industries.

#### **Assessment of No Fiscal Impact**

The technical changes in the bill do not substantively change any policy or practice, and will not change the revenue or expenditures of any state agency or local government. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
