	The bill allows a person to remove, discontinue, or replace telecommunications equipment identified as a threat to national security without obtaining additional permits from local governments. It may decrease local revenue and expenditures on an ongoing basis.

### **Summary of Legislation**

The Federal Communications Commission publishes a list of telecommunications equipment and services that pose a national security threat and should be removed, discontinued, or replaced. The bill establishes that a person who removes, discontinues, or replaces any equipment in the covered list is not required to receive additional permits from a local government if the local government receives notification and replacement equipment is functionally similar to the removed equipment.

### **Local Government**

The bill may minimally impact local governments in two ways. First, it may reduce local government permit revenue and workload for affected projects. Second, local governments may have additional workload to update information and permit-related materials to reflect the change under the bill.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
