The bill requires the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) to adopt rules that permit the batching of health insurance claims for arbitration, so that they may considered jointly under the same arbitration fee and payment determination.

### **State Expenditures**

Workload will minimally increase in DORA for rulemaking, which requires legal services provided by the Department of Law. Workload in the Division of Insurance (DOI) in DORA, which receives between 100 and 500 requests for arbitration annually, may minimally decrease if batching claims expedites them, and may minimally increase if allowing for claims to be batched results in more claims being filed. Workload impacts can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
