	The bill increases the coursework hours required for a massage therapist license. The bill minimally increases state workload in FY 2024-25 only.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, an individual applying for a massage therapist license from the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) must complete at least 500 total hours of coursework and clinical work from an approved massage school. The bill increases this requirement to 650 hours effective July 1, 2024, with an exception for individuals who are enrolled at a massage school at that time and go on to complete their education an apply for a license within specified time frames.

State Expenditures

For FY 2024-25 only, the bill minimally increases workload in the Department of Regulatory Affairs to update policies and conduct education and outreach. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature, and applies to licensure applications on or after this date.
