The bill increases the coursework hours required for a massage therapist license. The bill minimally increases state workload in FY 2024-25 only.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, an individual applying for a massage therapist license from the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) must complete at least 500 total hours of coursework and clinical work from an approved massage school. The bill increases this requirement to 650 hours effective July 1, 2024. Persons enrolled at a massage school at that time and who complete their education by October 1, 2025 meet this coursework requirement.

State Expenditures

For FY 2024-25 only, the bill minimally increases workload in the Department of Regulatory Affairs to update policies and conduct education and outreach. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 7, 2024.
