Summary of Legislation

This concurrent resolution refers a question to voters at the 2024 general election to repeal the constitutional provision that states a marriage is only valid if it is between one man and one woman.

Background

In 2015, the United States Supreme Court ruled in Obergefell v. Hodges that all states must grant and recognize same-sex marriages.

State Expenditures

Removing the same-sex marriage prohibition from the state constitution will have no impact on state agency or local government revenue or expenditures, as it conforms the constitution with current practices following the Supreme Court decision in Obergefell v. Hodges. However, by referring a measure to voters at the November 2024 general election, this resolution will impact state election costs.

Page 2 April 22, 2024

While no additional appropriation is required, certain election costs are incurred by the state when ballot measures are referred. These include reimbursing counties for certain election costs; publishing the text and title of the measure in newspapers across the state; and preparing and mailing the Blue Book.

Effective Date

If approved by voters at the 2024 general election, this measure takes effect upon proclamation of the Governor, no later than 30 days after the official canvass of the vote is completed.
