A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING ADJUSTMENTS TO THE NECESSARY DOCUMENT PROGRAM**
102 **ADMINISTERED BY THE OFFICE OF HEALTH EQUITY IN THE**
103 **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Beginning on July 1, 2027, the bill adjusts aspects of the necessary document program (program) administered by the office of health equity in the department of public health and environment, which program assists certain populations of Colorado residents with paying the fees to acquire necessary documents. The bill clarifies that an individual who is

eligible under the program may obtain necessary documents without charge at participating division of motor vehicles locations, participating vital statistics offices, or participating mobile units or from authorized representatives that offer driver's licenses, identification card services, or vital statistics certificates and reports.

The bill establishes that an individual may self-attest to the individual's eligibility under the program. The bill does not change the identity verification requirements that may be required to obtain a necessary document.

The bill also specifies that an individual who is eligible for the program is not subject to the fees charged by the department of revenue for driver's licenses or identification cards.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly
3 finds and declares that:

4 (a) The cost of identification documents can be prohibitive for
5 some individuals, particularly individuals experiencing homelessness,
6 individuals fleeing domestic violence, and individuals who have been
7 displaced by a natural disaster;

8 (b) Without necessary identification documents, individuals
9 cannot access financial services, drive legally, comply with certain law
10 enforcement requests, or access health care, housing, employment, or
11 public services and benefits;

12 (c) Since 2016, the necessary document program has provided a
13 critical service to eligible individuals who are unable to pay for essential
14 identification documents;

15 (d) Certain demographic groups, such as residents of rural
16 Colorado; unaccompanied youth; individuals who are lesbian, gay,
17 bisexual, or transgender; and Black people, Indigenous people, and other
18 people of color, have been overrepresented in their participation in the
19 necessary document program and may face additional barriers to

1 accessing the identification documents necessary to meet basic life needs;

2 (e) Because of the program's complicated structure, geographic
3 inconsistencies, and low level of funding, which has remained stagnant
4 since the program's creation, the necessary document program currently
5 falls short of meeting statewide need by as much as 90%; and

6 (f) This has resulted in social service providers running out of
7 vouchers to distribute to individuals in need, and, in some cases, the
8 providers are covering costs out of their own pocket, which has resulted
9 in social service providers having less money for other critical
10 organizational functions.

11 (2) Therefore, the general assembly further declares that it is
12 necessary to adjust the necessary document program to better meet the
13 needs of Colorado by allowing eligible individuals access to identification
14 documents available through the program at the point of service.

15 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2208, **amend**
16 (2) and (3) as follows:

17 **25-4-2208. Necessary document program - report -**
18 **appropriation - definition.** (2) (a) The office shall administer a
19 necessary document program ~~The office shall make one or more grants~~
20 ~~per fiscal year to, enter into one or more vendor contracts with, or both,~~
21 ~~a nonprofit entity or collection of nonprofit entities that conduct a~~
22 ~~collaborative identification project~~ to assist Colorado residents who are
23 victims of domestic violence, ARE impacted by a natural disaster,
24 ~~low-income, disabled, homeless, or elderly~~ EARN LOW INCOMES, HAVE
25 DISABILITIES, ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS, OR ARE ELDERLY and
26 who are seeking documentation of their identity, status, or citizenship by
27 paying the fees to acquire a necessary document.

1 (b) (I) ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2027, AND TO THE EXTENT THAT
2 MONEY APPROPRIATED TO THE OFFICE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF
3 THIS SECTION IS AVAILABLE, AN INDIVIDUAL SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION
4 (2)(a) OF THIS SECTION WHO NEEDS TO OBTAIN ANY NECESSARY
5 DOCUMENTS MAY OBTAIN THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS WITHOUT COST TO
6 THE INDIVIDUAL AND WITHOUT A PHYSICAL VOUCHER AT:

- 7 (A) PARTICIPATING DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES LOCATIONS;
- 8 (B) PARTICIPATING MOBILE UNITS OR FROM AUTHORIZED
9 REPRESENTATIVES THAT OFFER DRIVER'S LICENSES, IDENTIFICATION CARD
10 SERVICES, VITAL STATISTICS CERTIFICATES, VITAL STATISTICS REPORTS, OR
11 RELATED DOCUMENTS AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1)(c) OF THIS
12 SECTION; OR
13 (C) PARTICIPATING VITAL STATISTICS OFFICES.

14 (II) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY SELF-ATTEST TO THE INDIVIDUAL'S
15 ELIGIBILITY TO RECEIVE ASSISTANCE FROM THE NECESSARY DOCUMENT
16 PROGRAM.

18 (c) NOTHING IN THIS SUBSECTION (2) CHANGES THE IDENTITY
19 VERIFICATION REQUIREMENTS THAT MAY BE REQUIRED TO OBTAIN A
20 NECESSARY DOCUMENT.

21 (3) (a) The general assembly shall annually appropriate to the
22 office up to three hundred thousand dollars from the general fund. The
23 office shall expend the money for the purposes specified in this section.
24 ~~including up to fifteen thousand dollars for the office's direct and indirect~~
25 ~~costs in administering the necessary document program.~~

26 (b) THE OFFICE SHALL USE THE MONEY APPROPRIATED PURSUANT
27 TO SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE FOLLOWING:

1 (I) UP TO FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THE OFFICE'S DIRECT
2 AND INDIRECT COSTS OF ADMINISTERING THE NECESSARY DOCUMENT
3 PROGRAM;

4 (II) TO REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT FOR FEES FOR THE ISSUANCE
5 OF VITAL STATISTICS CERTIFICATES, VITAL STATISTICS REPORTS, OR
6 RELATED DOCUMENTS AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTIONS (1)(b)(III) AND
7 (1)(c) OF THIS SECTION; AND

8 (III) TO REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE FOR THE
9 ISSUANCE OF DRIVER'S LICENSES, IDENTIFICATION CARDS, OR RELATED
10 DOCUMENTS AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTIONS (1)(b)(I), (1)(b)(II), AND
11 (1)(c) OF THIS SECTION.

12 (c) (I) THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE
13 SHALL EACH SUBMIT REQUESTS TO THE OFFICE FOR REIMBURSEMENT
14 BASED ON THE ACTUAL NUMBER OF NECESSARY DOCUMENTS ISSUED BY
15 THE DEPARTMENT OR THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND IN THE MANNER
16 DETERMINED BY THE OFFICE.

17 (II) THE OFFICE SHALL PROVIDE REIMBURSEMENTS TO THE
18 DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE IN A MANNER
19 DETERMINED APPROPRIATE BY THE DEPARTMENT UNTIL THE MONEY
20 APPROPRIATED TO THE OFFICE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF THIS
21 SECTION IS NO LONGER AVAILABLE.

22 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-2-114.5, **add** (8)
23 as follows:

24 **42-2-114.5. Fees for driver's licenses, identification cards, and**
25 **related services - crediting to DRIVES account - fee setting**
26 **procedures - rules.** (8) IF THERE IS MONEY AVAILABLE FROM THE
27 APPROPRIATION MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 25-4-2208 (3), THE

1 DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT CHARGE OR COLLECT THE FEES ESTABLISHED IN
2 THIS SECTION FROM AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DEMONSTRATES ELIGIBILITY TO
3 RECEIVE ASSISTANCE UNDER THE NECESSARY DOCUMENT PROGRAM
4 ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 25-4-2208 AND ADMINISTERED BY THE OFFICE OF
5 HEALTH EQUITY IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND
6 ENVIRONMENT.

7 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-2-306, **add** (3) as
8 follows:

9 **42-2-306. Fees - disposition.** (3) IF THERE IS MONEY AVAILABLE
10 FROM THE APPROPRIATION MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 25-4-2208 (3),
11 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT CHARGE OR COLLECT THE FEES ESTABLISHED
12 IN THIS SECTION FROM AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DEMONSTRATES ELIGIBILITY
13 TO RECEIVE ASSISTANCE UNDER THE NECESSARY DOCUMENT PROGRAM
14 ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 25-4-2208 AND ADMINISTERED BY THE OFFICE OF
15 HEALTH EQUITY IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND
16 ENVIRONMENT.

17 **SECTION 5. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
18 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
19 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
20 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
21 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
22 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
23 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
24 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
25 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
