Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill merges 2 existing medicaid waiver programs for children into one children's home- and community-based services waiver program, known as the children with complex health needs waiver program. The bill relocates provisions to the new program due to the repeal of the 2 existing waiver programs.

OFFERED BY A LICENSED HEALTH-CARE FACILITY OR PROVIDER AND THAT
 IS SPECIFICALLY FOCUSED ON THE PROVISION OF SERVICES IN ORDER TO:
 (I) PROVIDE ELIGIBLE CHILDREN WITH RELIEF FROM THE
 SYMPTOMS, PAIN, AND STRESS OF COMPLEX HEALTH NEEDS, WHATEVER
 THE DIAGNOSIS; AND

6 (II) IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR BOTH THE ELIGIBLE CHILD
7 AND THE CHILD'S FAMILY.

8 (c) "RESPITE CARE SERVICES" MEANS SHORT-TERM SERVICES 9 PROVIDED TO AN ELIGIBLE CHILD IN THE CHILD'S HOME OR IN A FACILITY 10 APPROVED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT IN ORDER TO TEMPORARILY 11 RELIEVE THE CHILD'S FAMILY OR OTHER HOME CARE PROVIDERS FROM THE 12 CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF THE ELIGIBLE CHILD, INCLUDING ROOM AND 13 BOARD, PERSONAL CARE, AND OTHER RELATED SERVICES.

(3) (a) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL SEEK ANY FEDERAL
AUTHORIZATION NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT A WAIVER PROGRAM FOR
CHILDREN WITH COMPLEX HEALTH NEEDS. THE STATE BOARD SHALL
ESTABLISH, BY RULE, TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED OR REQUIRED BY THE
FEDERAL WAIVER, THE TYPES OF SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE WAIVER
PROGRAM, WHICH MUST INCLUDE RESPITE CARE SERVICES, PALLIATIVE
CARE, AND BEREAVEMENT SERVICES.

(b) A CHILD IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE WAIVER PROGRAM IF THE CHILD
is under nineteen years of age, is eligible for the state medical
assistance program pursuant to this article 6 and articles 4 and
5 of this title 25.5, and has a life-limiting illness or qualifies for
nursing facility or hospital level of care.

Effective date. This act takes effect July 1, 2025; 24 except that section 6 of this act takes effect July 1, 2026. 25 SECTION 8. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, 26 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
