### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING AUTHORIZING AN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST TO
102 PRESCRIBE DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT.

### **Bill Summary**

The bill authorizes an occupational therapist to directly recommend or prescribe durable medical equipment to a patient without requesting the prescription from a licensed physician.

1	<b>SECTION 1.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-2/0-104, amend
2	(10) introductory portion; and add (10)(d) as follows:
3	12-270-104. Definitions - rules. As used in this article 270, unless
4	the context otherwise requires:
5	(10) "Occupational therapy" means the therapeutic use of
6	occupations, including everyday life activities with individuals, groups,
7	populations, or organizations, to support participation, performance, and
8	function in roles and situations in home, school, workplace, community,
9	and other settings. Occupational therapy is provided for habilitation,
10	rehabilitation, and the promotion of health and wellness to persons
11	INDIVIDUALS who have, or are at risk for developing, an illness, injury,
12	disease, disorder, condition, impairment, disability, activity limitation, or
13	participation restriction. Occupational therapy uses everyday life activities
14	to promote mental health and support functioning in people INDIVIDUALS
15	who have, or who are at risk of experiencing, a range of mental health
16	disorders, including psychiatric, behavioral, emotional, and substance use
17	disorders. Occupational therapy addresses the physical, cognitive,
18	psychosocial, sensory, perceptual, and other aspects of performance in a
19	variety of contexts and environments to support engagement in
20	occupations that affect physical health, mental health, well-being, and
21	quality of life. The practice of occupational therapy includes:
22	(d) THE AUTHORITY TO DIRECTLY RECOMMEND AND PRESCRIBE
23	DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT TO A PATIENT WITHOUT REQUESTING THE
24	PRESCRIPTION FROM A LICENSED PHYSICIAN. <u>A PRESCRIBING</u>
25	OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST SHALL CONSULT WITH THE PATIENT
26	CONCERNING PAYMENT OPTIONS FOR DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT.
27	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act

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takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 1 2 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 3 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 4 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 5 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 6 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 7 8

official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
