A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING AN INCREASE IN THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF 102 TRANSPORTATION PLANNING REGIONS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill increases the maximum number of transportation planning regions of the state from 15 to 16. This increase in the maximum number of transportation planning regions results in the potential membership of the statewide transportation advisory committee also increasing by one member, from 17 to 18 members.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 43-1-1102, amend
3	(8)(a) as follows:
4	43-1-1102. Definitions. For the purposes of this part 11, unless
5	the context otherwise requires:
6	(8) (a) "Transportation planning region" means a region of the
7	state as defined by the rule or regulation process required by section
8	43-1-1103 (5). The maximum number of such regions shall be fifteen IS
9	SIXTEEN unless such number is increased pursuant to paragraph (b) of this
10	subsection (8) (b) of this section.
11	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
12	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
13	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
14	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
15	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
16	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
17	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
18	November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
19	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
