### **Bill Summary**

Under current law, retail establishments are prohibited from providing plastic carryout bags at the point of sale, but may provide recycled paper carryout bags for a fee of at least 10 cents per bag. The bill repeals the requirement that retail establishments charge a fee for providing recycled paper carryout bags.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-17-503, repeal (8)
3	as follows:
4	25-17-503. <b>Definitions - rules.</b> As used in this part 5, unless the
5	context otherwise requires:
6	(8) "Recycled paper carryout bag" means a carryout bag made
7	from one hundred percent:
8	(a) Recycled material; or
9	(b) Other post-consumer content.
10	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-17-504, amend
11	(1) introductory portion as follows:
12	25-17-504. Restrictions on use of single-use plastic carryout
13	bag - inventory exception. (1) Subject to section 25-17-505 (1), on and
14	after January 1, 2024, A store or retail food establishment shall not
15	provide a single-use plastic carryout bag to a customer; except that a retail
16	food establishment need not comply with this section if the retail food
17	establishment:
18	<b>SECTION 3.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, <b>repeal</b> 25-17-505.
19	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
20	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
21	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
22	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
23	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
24	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take

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- 1 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 3 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
