A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING REPORTING STATISTICS ON RESTITUTION PAYMENTS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <http://leg.colorado.gov>.)

Starting with the judicial department's 2026 "SMART Act" hearing, the bill requires the state court administrator to report statistics concerning restitution payments received and owed during the previous 5 state fiscal years.

1 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 13-3-101, **add** (13.5)
2 as follows:

3 **13-3-101. State court administrator - duties - report -**
4 **definitions - repeal.** (13.5) NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-136
5 (11)(a)(I), DURING THE 2026 REGULAR SESSION AND EACH REGULAR
6 SESSION THEREAFTER, THE STATE COURT ADMINISTRATOR OR THE
7 ADMINISTRATOR'S DESIGNEE SHALL PRESENT AT THE JUDICIAL
8 DEPARTMENT'S "SMART ACT" HEARING PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-7-203
9 THE FOLLOWING STATISTICS CONCERNING RESTITUTION FOR EACH OF THE
10 PREVIOUS FIVE STATE FISCAL YEARS:

- 11 (a) THE AMOUNT OF RESTITUTION PAID TO:
 - 12 (I) INDIVIDUALS; AND
 - 13 (II) INSURANCE COMPANIES;
- 14 (b) THE PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS OWING RESTITUTION WHO
15 ARE:
 - 16 (I) AMERICAN INDIAN OR ALASKA NATIVE;
 - 17 (II) ASIAN;
 - 18 (III) BLACK OR AFRICAN AMERICAN;
 - 19 (IV) NATIVE HAWAIIAN OR OTHER PACIFIC ISLANDER;
 - 20 (V) WHITE;
 - 21 (VI) HISPANIC OR LATINO;
 - 22 (VII) NON-HISPANIC OR NON-LATINO;
 - 23 (VIII) MALE;
 - 24 (IX) FEMALE;
 - 25 (X) UNDER TWENTY- FIVE YEARS OF AGE;
 - 26 (XI) AT LEAST TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE BUT UNDER FORTY
27 YEARS OF AGE;

1 (XII) AT LEAST FORTY YEARS OF AGE BUT UNDER SIXTY YEARS OF
2 AGE; AND

3 (XIII) SIXTY YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER;

4 (c) FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO OWE RESTITUTION, THE PERCENTAGE OF
5 INDIVIDUALS WHO OWE RESTITUTION IN EACH COUNTY;

6 (d) FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE IN DEFAULT ON RESTITUTION
7 PAYMENTS:

8 (I) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS IN DEFAULT;

9 (II) THE PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS IN DEFAULT WHO ARE:

10 (A) AMERICAN INDIAN OR ALASKA NATIVE;

11 (B) ASIAN;

12 (C) BLACK OR AFRICAN AMERICAN;

13 (D) NATIVE HAWAIIAN OR OTHER PACIFIC ISLANDER;

14 (E) WHITE;

15 (F) HISPANIC OR LATINO;

16 (G) NON-HISPANIC OR NON-LATINO;

17 (H) MALE;

18 (I) FEMALE;

19 (J) UNDER TWENTY- FIVE YEARS OF AGE;

20 (K) AT LEAST TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE BUT UNDER FORTY
21 YEARS OF AGE;

22 (L) AT LEAST FORTY YEARS OF AGE BUT UNDER SIXTY YEARS OF
23 AGE; AND

24 (M) SIXTY YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER;

25 (III) THE TOTAL PRINCIPAL AMOUNT AND THE TOTAL INTEREST
26 OWED BY THE INDIVIDUALS IN DEFAULT;

27 (IV) THE AVERAGE LENGTH OF TIME THAT THE INDIVIDUALS HAVE

1 BEEN IN DEFAULT;

2 (e) FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE IN DEFAULT ON RESTITUTION
3 PAYMENTS, THE PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE IN DEFAULT IN
4 EACH COUNTY; AND

5 (f) THE AMOUNT SPENT BY THE STATE TO COLLECT RESTITUTION
6 FROM INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE IN DEFAULT ON RESTITUTION PAYMENTS.

7 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,
8 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
10 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
11 institutions.
