## A BILL FOR AN ACT

### 101 CONCERNING THE TIMING OF THE ENACTMENT OF THE "INTERSTATE

102 COMPACT ON PLACEMENT OF CHILDREN".

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. In 1975, the general assembly enacted the original "Interstate Compact on Placement of Children" (compact). In 2024, the general assembly enacted an updated version of the compact. The bill clarifies that the original compact remains in effect until the updated compact is enacted into law by 35 states. 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Session Laws of Colorado 2024, amend
3 24-60-1804, Colorado Revised Statutes, as repealed and re-enacted by
4 section 2 of chapter 248, as follows:

5 24-60-1804. Notice to revisor of statutes. This part 18 SECTION 6 2 OF SENATE BILL 24-125, ENACTED IN 2024, will take effect on the date 7 the compact is enacted into law in the thirty-fifth compact state. The 8 executive director of the Colorado department of human services shall 9 notify the revisor of statutes in writing of the date when the condition 10 specified in this section has occurred by e-mailing the notice to 11 revisorofstatutes.ga@coleg.gov. This part 18 SECTION 2 OF SENATE BILL 12 24-125, ENACTED IN 2024, takes effect upon the date identified in the 13 notice that the thirty-fifth state adopted the compact or, if the notice does 14 not specify that date, upon the date of the notice to the revisor of statutes.

15 SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, 16 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for 18 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state 19 institutions.
