A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING ESTABLISHING AN AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER** ■
102 **NOTIFICATION SYSTEM IN THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE.**

Bill Summary

The bill requires the division of criminal justice in the department of public safety (division) to establish an automated protection order victim notification system (notification system) to provide a victim, a victim's immediate family, and other interested persons (registered users) with information related to a criminal or civil protection order. The notification system must disseminate specific information to registered

users in English and Spanish through a telephone call, text message, or mobile phone application. The bill authorizes the division to contract with a third-party entity to provide the functionality for the notification system.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add 24-33.5-537** as
3 follows:

4 **24-33.5-537. Automated protection order notification system**

5 **- definitions.** (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT
6 OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

7 (a) "ADVOCATE" MEANS A PERSON WHOSE REGULAR OR
8 VOLUNTEER DUTIES INCLUDE SUPPORTING A PROTECTED PERSON.

9 (b) "IMMEDIATE FAMILY" MEANS A PROTECTED PERSON'S SPOUSE,
10 CHILD, OR PARENT, OR A BLOOD RELATIVE WHO LIVES IN THE SAME
11 RESIDENCE AS THE PROTECTED PERSON AND IS NOT A RESTRAINED PERSON.

12 (c) "INTERESTED PERSON" MEANS A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER,
13 A JUDICIAL OFFICER, A DISTRICT ATTORNEY, OR AN ADVOCATE.

14 (d) "PROTECTED PERSON" MEANS THE PERSON IDENTIFIED IN A
15 PROTECTION ORDER AS THE PERSON FOR WHOSE BENEFIT THE PROTECTION
16 ORDER WAS ISSUED.

17 (e) "REGISTERED USER" MEANS A PROTECTED PERSON, PROTECTED
18 PERSON'S IMMEDIATE FAMILY, OR OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS WHO ARE
19 REGISTERED WITH THE AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER NOTIFICATION
20 SYSTEM ESTABLISHED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION.

21 (f) "RESTRAINED PERSON" MEANS THE PERSON IDENTIFIED IN THE
22 PROTECTION ORDER AS THE PERSON PROHIBITED FROM ENGAGING IN
23 SPECIFIED ACTS.

24 (2) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, THE DIVISION SHALL

1 ESTABLISH AN AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER NOTIFICATION SYSTEM TO
2 PROVIDE A PROTECTED PERSON, THE PROTECTED PERSON'S IMMEDIATE
3 FAMILY, AND OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS WITH INFORMATION RELATED
4 TO A PROTECTION ORDER ISSUED PURSUANT TO SECTION 18-1-1001 OR
5 ARTICLE 14 OF TITLE 13.

6 (3) THE AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER NOTIFICATION SYSTEM
7 MUST INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION, IF
8 AVAILABLE:

9 (a) THE DATE THE PROTECTION ORDER WAS SERVED OR WAS
10 ATTEMPTED TO BE SERVED;

11 (b) AN ADVANCE NOTICE OCCURRING ONE HUNDRED TWENTY DAYS
12 BEFORE AND AGAIN OCCURRING THIRTY DAYS BEFORE THE PROTECTION
13 ORDER EXPIRES;

14 (c) WHETHER AN EXTREME RISK PROTECTION ORDER WAS ISSUED
15 AGAINST THE RESTRAINED PERSON PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 14.5 OF TITLE
16 13, AND IF SO, THE DATE THE EXTREME RISK PROTECTION ORDER WAS
17 SERVED OR WAS ATTEMPTED TO BE SERVED;

18 (d) WHETHER THE RESTRAINED PERSON APPLIED FOR AND WAS
19 DENIED THE PURCHASE OR TRANSFER OF A FIREARM AS THE RESULT OF A
20 BACKGROUND CHECK; AND

21 (e) WHETHER THE RESTRAINED PERSON COMPLETED AND
22 SUBMITTED A FIREARM PURCHASE OR TRANSFER APPLICATION THAT
23 INDICATED THE RESTRAINED PERSON WAS INELIGIBLE TO POSSESS A
24 FIREARM PURSUANT TO STATE OR FEDERAL LAW.

25 (4) THE COLORADO BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION IN THE DIVISION
26 SHALL MAKE THE INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS
27 SECTION AVAILABLE TO THE DIVISION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING THE

1 INFORMATION TO A PROTECTED PERSON, THE PROTECTED PERSON'S
2 IMMEDIATE FAMILY, OR OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS PURSUANT TO
3 SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION.

4 (5) THE AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER NOTIFICATION SYSTEM
5 MUST DISSEMINATE THE INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF
6 THIS SECTION TO REGISTERED USERS IN ENGLISH AND SPANISH THROUGH
7 A TELEPHONE CALL, EMAIL, TEXT MESSAGE, OR MOBILE PHONE
8 APPLICATION.

9 (6) THE DIVISION MAY CONTRACT WITH A THIRD-PARTY ENTITY TO
10 PROVIDE THE FUNCTIONALITY FOR THE AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER
11 NOTIFICATION SYSTEM. THE THIRD-PARTY ENTITY MUST BE ABLE TO:

12 (a) OPERATE A SUPPORT CENTER THAT IS OPEN TWENTY-FOUR
13 HOURS A DAY, SEVEN DAYS A WEEK;

14 (b) SEND EMAILS AND TEXT MESSAGES TO REGISTERED USERS
15 THROUGH A MOBILE PHONE APPLICATION;

16 (c) PROVIDE SPANISH INTERPRETATION SERVICES; AND

17 (d) PROVIDE DIRECTORY OR CONTACT INFORMATION FOR
18 AVAILABLE SUPPORTIVE RESOURCES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO,
19 HOUSING, HEALTH CARE AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE, DOMESTIC
20 VIOLENCE VICTIM ASSISTANCE, AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

21 (7) THE COLORADO BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION, THE DIVISION,
22 AND THE THIRD-PARTY ENTITY, IF ONE WAS CONTRACTED PURSUANT TO
23 SUBSECTION (6) OF THIS SECTION, SHALL IMPLEMENT ANY NECESSARY
24 DATA-SHARING STANDARDS IN ORDER TO PROTECT DATA FROM BEING
25 TRANSFERRED FROM THE COLORADO BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND THE
26 DIVISION TO THE CONTRACTED THIRD-PARTY ENTITY.

27 (8) THE AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

1 MUST BE COMPATIBLE WITH THE STATE'S EXISTING AUTOMATED VICTIM
2 NOTIFICATION SYSTEM DESCRIBED IN SECTION 24-4.1-303 (15)(c).

3 (9) A PUBLIC ENTITY, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 24-10-103, IS
4 IMMUNE FROM LIABILITY IN ANY CIVIL ACTION BASED ON THE PUBLIC
5 ENTITY'S RELEASE OF INFORMATION OR THE FAILURE TO RELEASE
6 INFORMATION RELATED TO THE AUTOMATED PROTECTION ORDER
7 NOTIFICATION SYSTEM AS LONG AS THE RELEASE OR FAILURE TO RELEASE
8 WAS NOT THE RESULT OF GROSS NEGLIGENCE.

9 (10) THE DIVISION MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS,
10 GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES FOR THE
11 PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.

12 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
13 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
14 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
15 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
16 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
17 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
18 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
19 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
20 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
