A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING ADJUSTMENTS TO SCHOOL FUNDING FOR THE 2024-25

102 BUDGET YEAR, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, INCREASING

103 AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. The general assembly recognizes that for the 2024-25 budget year the actual funded pupil count is higher than anticipated when the appropriation was established in the 2024 legislative session for total program funding for the 2024-25 budget year.

In addition, local property tax revenue and specific ownership tax

revenue are lower than anticipated, resulting in a decrease in the local share of total program funding for the 2024-25 budget year.

The bill declares the general assembly's intent to increase the state share of districts' total program funding by \$64,076,611 for the 2024-25 budget year.

The bill adjusts a repeal date for the total program reserve fund.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly 3 finds and declares that: 4 (a) For the 2024-25 budget year, the actual funded pupil count is 5 higher than anticipated when the appropriation was established in the 6 2024 legislative session for total program funding for the 2024-25 budget 7 year. As a result, total program funding is \$38,467,082 higher than 8 anticipated when appropriations were established in the 2024 legislative 9 session. (b) Based on actual local property tax revenue and specific 10 11 ownership tax revenue available to school districts for the 2024-25 budget 12 year, the local share of total program funding is \$25,609,529 lower than 13 anticipated when the appropriations were established in the 2024 14 legislative session. 15 (2) Therefore, it is the general assembly's intent to increase the 16 state share of districts' total program funding by \$64,076,611 for the 17 2024-25 budget year. 18 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-54-104, amend 19 (5.5) as follows: 20 22-54-104. District total program - legislative declaration -21 definitions - repeal. (5.5) For the 2024-25 budget year, and each budget 22 year thereafter, the department of education and the staff of the legislative

1 council shall determine, based on budget projections, the amount to 2 ensure that, for the 2024-25 budget year, the sum of total program 3 funding for all districts, including funding for institute charter schools, is 4 not less than nine billion seven hundred thirty-five million seven hundred 5 sixty-seven thousand four hundred twenty-nine dollars (\$9,735,767,429) 6 NINE BILLION SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE MILLION ONE HUNDRED 7 FIFTY-TWO THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE DOLLARS 8 (\$9,773,152,749); except that the department of education and the staff 9 of the legislative council shall make mid-year revisions to replace 10 projections with actual figures, including, but not limited to, actual pupil 11 enrollment, assessed valuations, and specific ownership tax revenue from 12 the prior year, to determine any necessary changes in the amount of the 13 reduction to maintain total program funding for the applicable budget 14 year that is consistent with this subsection (5.5). 15 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-45-103, amend

the purpose of this footnote is to specify what portion of this appropriation is intended to be available for the Teacher Recruitment Education and Preparation (TREP) Program for FY 2024-25. It is the General Assembly's intent that the Department of Education be authorized to utilize up to \$2,561,000 \$2,151,240 of this appropriation to fund qualified students identified as TREP Program participants. This amount is calculated based on an estimated 250 210 FTE TREP Program participants funded at a rate of \$10,244 per FTE pursuant to section 22-54-104 (4.7), C.R.S.

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1 SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, 2 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 3 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for 4 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state 5 institutions.
