A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING MEASURES RELATED TO PROHIBITING A PEACE OFFICER

102 FROM ASKING A PERSON DURING A TRAFFIC STOP IF THE PERSON

103 KNOWS THE REASON FOR THE TRAFFIC STOP.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill prohibits a peace officer from asking a driver or passenger if they know the reason for the traffic stop, and requires the peace officer to inform the driver of the reason for the traffic stop unless it is unreasonable under the totality of the circumstances.

A peace officer's failure to comply with the bill is not grounds for

exclusion of evidence or dismissal of a charge.

- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 42-4-1704.5 as
 3 follows:
- 4 42-4-1704.5. Peace officer questioning during a traffic stop.
 5 (1) A PEACE OFFICER WHO IS MAKING A TRAFFIC STOP SHALL NOT ASK THE
 6 VEHICLE OPERATOR OR A PASSENGER IF THE VEHICLE OPERATOR OR
 7 PASSENGER KNOWS THE REASON FOR THE TRAFFIC STOP.
- 8 (2) A PEACE OFFICER WHO IS MAKING A TRAFFIC STOP SHALL 9 INFORM THE VEHICLE OPERATOR OF THE REASON OR REASONS FOR THE 10 TRAFFIC STOP, UNLESS INFORMING THE OPERATOR OF THE REASON OR 11 REASONS FOR THE TRAFFIC STOP WOULD BE UNREASONABLE UNDER THE 12 TOTALITY OF THE CIRCUMSTANCES.
- 13 (3) A PEACE OFFICER'S FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS SECTION IS
 14 NOT GROUNDS FOR THE EXCLUSION OF EVIDENCE OR DISMISSAL OF A
 15 CHARGE.

16 SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, 17 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 18 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for 19 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state 20 institutions.
