A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING REQUIRING THE PARKS AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION TO

102 USE THE BEST AVAILABLE SCIENCE TO MANAGE WILDLIFE.

Bill Summary

In Colorado's wildlife statutes, the legislative declaration commits the state to use hunting, trapping, and fishing as the primary methods of effecting wildlife harvests. The bill requires the parks and wildlife commission to use the best available wildlife and ecological science to adopt rules that benefit wildlife, whole ecosystem health, and all Coloradans. 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-1-101, amend (4)
3 as follows:

33-1-101. Legislative declaration. (4) The state shall utilize MAY
AUTHORIZE hunting, trapping, and fishing as the primary methods of
effecting necessary wildlife harvests IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BEST
AVAILABLE WILDLIFE AND ECOLOGICAL SCIENCE TO BENEFIT WILDLIFE,
WHOLE ECOSYSTEM HEALTH, AND ALL COLORADANS.

9 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-1-104, amend (1)
10 as follows:

33-1-104. General duties of commission. (1) The commission
is responsible for all wildlife management, for licensing requirements,
and for the promulgation ADOPTION of rules regulations, and ISSUANCE OF
orders concerning wildlife programs. THE COMMISSION SHALL APPLY, IN
ITS DECISION-MAKING, THE BEST AVAILABLE WILDLIFE AND ECOLOGICAL
SCIENCE TO ADOPT RULES THAT BENEFIT WILDLIFE, WHOLE ECOSYSTEM
HEALTH, AND ALL COLORADANS.

SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
