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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING CREATING A PILOT PROGRAM TO ENCOURAGE YOUTH IN**  
102 **FOSTER CARE TO GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL.**

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**Bill Summary**

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the fostering success pilot program (pilot program) in the department of human services (department). The pilot program is a 2-part program, which includes:

- The supplemental support for foster students program (supplemental support program), which awards \$2,000 scholarships annually to a foster care provider, kinship

foster care provider, or a non-certified kinship care provider (provider) who cares for a youth in the legal custody of a county department of human or social services until the youth graduates from high school; and

- The milestone incentives program (milestone program), which awards \$1,000 to a youth for successfully graduating from high school.

On or before September 30, 2025, subject to available appropriations, the department shall contract with a third-party administrator (administrator) to develop, implement, and administer the pilot program. The department shall contract with an administrator that is:

- A nonprofit organization;
- Experienced working with students and families; and
- Experienced administering student scholarship and grant programs.

On or before December 31, 2025, subject to available appropriations, the department shall establish a timeline for:

- Announcing the pilot program;
- Accepting applications from youth and their providers; and
- Selecting youth and their providers to participate in the pilot program.

The department shall select youth and provider participants in the order of applications received. A youth and their provider selected to participate in the pilot program must participate in the supplemental support program and the milestone program.

The administrator may contract with one or more private entities to develop and implement a system to establish scholarship accounts that allows payment to qualifying vendors by electronic means from an online portal.

The administrator shall:

- Ensure that the scholarship account is accessible through an online portal for the provider to facilitate payments to a qualifying vendor for the supplemental support program;
- Ensure the transfer of scholarship funds from the online portal directly to a qualifying vendor without direct access to scholarship funds by a provider; and
- Distribute money to each scholarship account.

The administrator shall ensure that a youth has sole access to the milestone program award funds. There are no restrictions on how the youth may use the milestone program award funds.

On or before July 1, 2028, the administrator shall administer a survey to youth and their providers to receive feedback on the pilot program.

On or before October 31, 2028, the administrator shall report to the

department the following information:

- The number of participants selected for the pilot program;
- The amount of money awarded through the pilot program;
- The survey results from youth and their providers; and
- How the pilot program affected the youth's performance in school.

On or before December 31, 2028, the department shall submit a report summarizing the information collected from the survey to the education committees of the house of representatives and senate, the health and human services committees of the house of representatives and senate, or their successor committees.

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 19-7-105 as  
3 follows:

4 **19-7-105. Fostering success pilot program - financial support**  
5 **for youth in foster care, kinship foster care, or non-certified kinship**  
6 **care - report - rules - definitions - repeal.** (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION,  
7 UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

8 (a) "FOSTERING SUCCESS PILOT PROGRAM" OR "PILOT PROGRAM"  
9 MEANS THE FOSTERING SUCCESS PILOT PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION  
10 (2) OF THIS SECTION, WHICH CONSISTS OF TWO PROGRAMS: THE  
11 SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM CREATED IN  
12 SUBSECTION (2)(a)(I) OF THIS SECTION AND THE MILESTONE INCENTIVES  
13 PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION (2)(a)(II) OF THIS SECTION.

14 (b) "MILESTONE INCENTIVES PROGRAM" MEANS THE MILESTONE  
15 INCENTIVES PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION (2)(a)(II) OF THIS  
16 SECTION.

17 (c) "PROVIDER" MEANS A FOSTER CARE PARENT OR A RELATIVE OR  
18 KIN WHO PROVIDES KINSHIP FOSTER CARE AND WHO IS CERTIFIED TO  
19 OPERATE A KINSHIP FOSTER CARE HOME PURSUANT TO SECTION 26-6-910.

1 "PROVIDER" ALSO INCLUDES A RELATIVE OR KIN WHO PROVIDES  
2 NON-CERTIFIED KINSHIP CARE, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 26-6-903.

3 (d) "QUALIFYING VENDOR" MEANS AN ELIGIBLE SERVICE VENDOR  
4 THAT THE THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR APPROVES TO PARTICIPATE AND  
5 PROVIDE SERVICES TO YOUTH AND PROVIDERS PARTICIPATING IN THE  
6 SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM.

7 (e) "SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM"  
8 MEANS THE SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM  
9 CREATED IN SUBSECTION (2)(a)(I) OF THIS SECTION.

10 (2) (a) THE FOSTERING SUCCESS PILOT PROGRAM IS CREATED IN  
11 THE DEPARTMENT. THE PILOT PROGRAM IS A TWO-PART PILOT PROGRAM  
12 THAT INCLUDES:

13 (I) THE SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM,  
14 WHICH AWARDS TWO-THOUSAND-DOLLAR SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENTS  
15 ANNUALLY TO A SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNT ESTABLISHED IN SUBSECTION  
16 (3)(a) OF THIS SECTION FOR A FOSTER CARE PROVIDER, KINSHIP FOSTER  
17 CARE PROVIDER, OR A NON-CERTIFIED KINSHIP CARE PROVIDER WHO CARES  
18 FOR A YOUTH   UNTIL THE YOUTH GRADUATES FROM HIGH SCHOOL TO BE  
19 USED FOR EDUCATION-RELATED EXPENSES FOR THE YOUTH; AND

20 (II) THE MILESTONE INCENTIVES PROGRAM, WHICH AWARDS A  
21 YOUTH WHO IS IN THE LEGAL CUSTODY OF A COUNTY DEPARTMENT AND  
22 LIVING IN A FOSTER CARE HOME, KINSHIP FOSTER CARE HOME, OR  
23 NON-CERTIFIED KINSHIP CARE HOME ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR  
24 SUCCESSFULLY GRADUATING FROM HIGH SCHOOL.

25 (b) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2025, SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE  
26 APPROPRIATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONTRACT WITH A  
27 THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR TO DEVELOP, IMPLEMENT, AND ADMINISTER

1 THE PILOT PROGRAM. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONTRACT WITH A  
2 THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR THAT IS:

3 (I) A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION, AS DEFINED IN SECTION  
4 26.5-5-303;

5 (II) EXPERIENCED WORKING WITH STUDENTS AND FAMILIES; AND

6 (III) EXPERIENCED ADMINISTERING STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP AND  
7 GRANT PROGRAMS.

8 (c) (I) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL EXAMINE URBAN, RURAL, AND  
9 SUBURBAN AREAS WITH HIGH RATES OF YOUTH IN FOSTER CARE TO  
10 IDENTIFY THE REGIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE PILOT PROGRAM.

11 (II) THE THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL IMPLEMENT THE  
12 PILOT PROGRAM IN THE REGIONS THAT THE DEPARTMENT IDENTIFIES  
13 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2)(c)(I) OF THIS SECTION.

14 (d) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2025, SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE  
15 APPROPRIATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A TIMELINE FOR:

16 (I) ANNOUNCING THE PILOT PROGRAM;

17 (II) ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FROM YOUTH AND THEIR  
18 PROVIDERS; AND

19 (III) SELECTING YOUTH AND THEIR PROVIDERS TO PARTICIPATE IN  
20 THE PILOT PROGRAM.

21 (e) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT NO MORE THAN TWO  
22 HUNDRED FIFTY YOUTH AND PROVIDER PARTICIPANTS IN THE ORDER OF  
23 APPLICATIONS RECEIVED. A YOUTH AND THEIR PROVIDER SELECTED TO  
24 PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM MUST PARTICIPATE IN THE  
25 SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM AND THE  
26 MILESTONE INCENTIVES PROGRAM.

27 (f) AS PART OF THE APPLICATION PROCESS, A YOUTH AND THEIR

1 PROVIDER MUST AGREE THAT THE YOUTH'S ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE MAY  
2 BE SHARED BY THE YOUTH'S EDUCATION PROVIDER, AS DEFINED IN  
3 SECTION 22-32-138 (1), WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AS  
4 DESCRIBED IN SECTION 22-32-138 (9.5)(b).

5 (3) (a) THE THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL ESTABLISH A  
6 SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNT ON BEHALF OF A YOUTH. THE THIRD-PARTY  
7 ADMINISTRATOR MAY CONTRACT WITH ONE OR MORE PRIVATE ENTITIES TO  
8 DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A COMMERCIALY VIABLE, COST-EFFECTIVE,  
9 AND PROVIDER-FRIENDLY SYSTEM TO:

10 (I) ESTABLISH SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNTS; AND

11 (II) MAXIMIZE PAYMENT FLEXIBILITY BY ALLOWING FOR PAYMENT  
12 OF SERVICES TO QUALIFYING VENDORS BY TRANSFERRING SCHOLARSHIP  
13 FUNDS BY ELECTRONIC OR ONLINE MEANS FROM AN ONLINE PORTAL.

14 (b) THE THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL:

15 (I) ENSURE THAT THE SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNT IS ACCESSIBLE  
16 THROUGH AN ONLINE PORTAL FOR THE PROVIDER TO FACILITATE  
17 PAYMENTS TO A QUALIFYING VENDOR WHO PROVIDES SERVICES TO YOUTH  
18 AND THEIR PROVIDERS PARTICIPATING IN THE SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR  
19 FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM;

20 (II) ENSURE THE DIRECT TRANSFER OF SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS FROM  
21 THE ONLINE PORTAL TO A QUALIFYING VENDOR TO PAY FOR EXPENSES;

22 (III) ENSURE YOUTH AND THEIR PROVIDERS CANNOT WITHDRAW  
23 OR HAVE DIRECT ACCESS TO THE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS; AND

24 (IV) DISTRIBUTE MONEY TO EACH SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNT.

25 (c) STARTING IN THE 2026-27 FISCAL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT  
26 SHALL DISTRIBUTE TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS TO YOUTH AND PROVIDERS  
27 FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT FOR FOSTER STUDENTS PROGRAM. THE

1 PROVIDERS MAY USE THE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS ON EDUCATION-RELATED  
2 SERVICES FOR YOUTH THAT ARE PROVIDED BY A QUALIFIED VENDOR THAT  
3 INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- 4 (I) AFTER-SCHOOL TUTORING SERVICES;
- 5 (II) COMPUTERS OR TECHNOLOGICAL DEVICES INTENDED FOR A  
6 YOUTH'S EDUCATIONAL NEEDS;
- 7 (III) TRANSPORTATION FEES;
- 8 (IV) EXPENSES OR FEES RELATED TO EXTRACURRICULAR  
9 ACTIVITIES, FIELD TRIPS, OR OTHER EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES; AND
- 10 (V) PERSONAL GROWTH EXPERIENCES, WHICH MAY INCLUDE  
11 PARTICIPATING IN SPORTS AND OUTDOOR NATURE EXPERIENCES.

12 (d) THE PROVIDER MAY NOT USE THE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS ON  
13 TUITION AND FEES FOR PRIVATE SCHOOL.

14 (e) SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS MUST BE SPENT WITHIN NINE MONTHS  
15 AFTER THE THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR DISTRIBUTES THE SCHOLARSHIP  
16 FUNDS IN THE YOUTH'S SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNT. AT THE END OF THE NINE  
17 MONTHS, UNSPENT SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS ARE REVERTED BACK TO THE  
18 DEPARTMENT.

19 (f) DECISIONS ABOUT THE YOUTH'S SERVICES MUST BE MADE IN  
20 CONSULTATION WITH THE YOUTH AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE YOUTH'S  
21 INDIVIDUALIZED NEEDS.

22 (4) (a) UPON A YOUTH'S GRADUATION, THE THIRD-PARTY  
23 ADMINISTRATOR SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE AWARD FUNDS DESCRIBED IN  
24 SUBSECTION (2)(a)(II) OF THIS SECTION INTO THE YOUTH'S PERSONAL  
25 ACCOUNT.

26 (b) THE THIRD-PARTY ADMINISTRATOR SHALL ENSURE THAT A  
27 YOUTH HAS SOLE ACCESS TO THE MILESTONE INCENTIVES PROGRAM

1 AWARD FUNDS. THERE ARE NO RESTRICTIONS ON HOW THE YOUTH MAY  
2 USE THE MILESTONE INCENTIVES PROGRAM AWARD FUNDS.

3 (5) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2028, THE THIRD-PARTY  
4 ADMINISTRATOR SHALL ADMINISTER A SURVEY TO YOUTH AND PROVIDERS  
5 TO RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

6 (a) FEEDBACK FROM PROVIDERS REGARDING THEIR EXPERIENCE  
7 PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM;

8 (b) FEEDBACK FROM YOUTH REGARDING THEIR EXPERIENCE  
9 PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; AND

10 (c) HOW YOUTH WHO RECEIVED AWARD FUNDS THROUGH THE  
11 MILESTONE INCENTIVES PROGRAM USED THE AWARD FUNDS.

12 (6) (a) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 31, 2028, THE THIRD-PARTY  
13 ADMINISTRATOR SHALL PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT WITH THE FOLLOWING  
14 INFORMATION:

15 (I) THE NUMBER OF APPLICANTS SELECTED FOR THE PILOT  
16 PROGRAM;

17 (II) THE AMOUNT OF MONEY AWARDED THROUGH THE PILOT  
18 PROGRAM;

19 (III) THE RESULTS OF THE SURVEY CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO  
20 SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS SECTION; AND

21 (IV) HOW THE PILOT PROGRAM AFFECTED THE YOUTH'S  
22 PERFORMANCE IN SCHOOL, INCLUDING, AT A MINIMUM:

23 (A) THE GRADUATION AND COMPLETION RATES OF YOUTH  
24 PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; AND

25 (B) THE AGGREGATED ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE OF YOUTH  
26 PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.

27 (b) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2028, THE DEPARTMENT OF



1 EDUCATION SHALL PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT THE INFORMATION  
2 REGARDING THE EFFECTS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM ON YOUTH IN SCHOOL AS  
3 DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (6)(a)(IV) OF THIS SECTION.

4 (c) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2028, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL  
5 SUBMIT A REPORT SUMMARIZING THE INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN  
6 SUBSECTION (6)(a) OF THIS SECTION TO THE EDUCATION COMMITTEES OF  
7 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATE, THE HEALTH AND HUMAN  
8 SERVICES COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATE,  
9 OR THEIR SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES.

10 (7) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT RULES FOR THE PURPOSES OF  
11 THIS SECTION.

12 (8) THE DEPARTMENT MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS,  
13 GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES FOR THE  
14 PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.

15 (9) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2031.  
16 BEFORE THE REPEAL, THIS SECTION IS SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW PURSUANT  
17 TO SECTION 24-34-104.

18 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-32-138, **add** (9.5)  
19 as follows:

20 **22-32-138. Out-of-home placement students - school stability,**  
21 **transfer, and enrollment procedures - absences - exemptions -**  
22 **provision of academic supports - report - definitions.** (9.5) (a) ON OR  
23 BEFORE JULY 1, 2028, AN EDUCATION PROVIDER WITH STUDENTS  
24 PARTICIPATING IN THE FOSTERING SUCCESS PILOT PROGRAM CREATED IN  
25 SECTION 19-7-105 (2) SHALL REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION,  
26 AT A MINIMUM, THE FOLLOWING:

27 (I) THE GRADUATION AND COMPLETION RATES OF STUDENTS

1 PARTICIPATING IN THE FOSTERING SUCCESS PILOT PROGRAM; AND

2 (II) THE AGGREGATED ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE OF STUDENTS  
3 PARTICIPATING IN THE FOSTERING SUCCESS PILOT PROGRAM.

4 (b) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2028, THE DEPARTMENT OF  
5 EDUCATION SHALL REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES THE  
6 INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (9.5)(a) OF THIS SECTION FOR  
7 PURPOSES OF SECTION 19-7-105 (6)(b).

8 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, **add**  
9 (32)(a)(XVI) as follows:

10 **24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies**  
11 **and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative**  
12 **declaration - repeal.** (32) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both,  
13 are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2031:

14 (XVI) THE FOSTERING SUCCESS PILOT PROGRAM CREATED IN  
15 SECTION 19-7-105.

16 **SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
17 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
18 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except  
19 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V  
20 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this  
21 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take  
22 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
23 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
24 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
