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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

### 101 CONCERNING ADDITIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCIAL REPORTING

102 **REQUIREMENTS.** 

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, the state charter school institute and each school district, board of cooperative services, and charter school is required to publicly report certain financial information online. The bill requires a school district to report all information for itself and for each of its traditional public schools beginning July 1, 2027. Each report must include additional information concerning actual marketing, student recruitment, lobbying, contractor, and education management provider expenditures and all sources of revenue.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-44-304, amend 3 (1)(a) introductory portion, (1)(d)(I), (1)(e), (1)(f), (3)(a), (4), and (5); and 4 add (1)(a.1), (1)(a.5), (1)(a.7), (1)(d)(III), (3)(a.5), and (6) as follows:5 22-44-304. Financial reporting - online access to information 6 - repeal. (1) (a) Commencing July 1, 2010, and on a continuing basis 7 thereafter, THROUGH THE 2026-27 BUDGET YEAR, the institute and each 8 school district, board of cooperative services, and charter school shall 9 post the following information online, in a downloadable AND 10 ACCESSIBLE format, for free public access: 11 (a.1) (I) SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, 12 EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2027. 13 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(a.1) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 14 2028. 15 (a.5) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2027, AND ON A CONTINUING BASIS 16 THEREAFTER, THE INSTITUTE, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE SCHOOL 17 DISTRICT AND FOR EACH OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S TRADITIONAL PUBLIC 18 SCHOOLS, EACH BOARD OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES, AND EACH CHARTER 19 SCHOOL SHALL POST THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION ON ITS PUBLIC 20 WEBSITE FOR FREE, IN A DOWNLOADABLE, ACCESSIBLE, AND SORTABLE 21 FORMAT: 22 (I) THE ANNUAL BUDGET; 23 (II) THE ANNUAL AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS; 24 (III) THE SALARY SCHEDULES OR POLICIES;

25 (IV) AN ITEMIZATION OF EACH REVENUE SOURCE, INCLUDING, AT

A MINIMUM, EACH LOCAL SOURCE; STATE SOURCE; FEDERAL SOURCE;
 PRIVATE SOURCE; GIFT, GRANT, OR DONATION WITH A VALUE EQUAL TO OR
 GREATER THAN FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS; INVESTMENT INCOME; AND
 PROPERTY INCOME. EACH ITEMIZATION MUST INCLUDE, AT A MINIMUM,
 THE REVENUE SOURCE'S NAME, THE REVENUE AMOUNT, AND A
 DESCRIPTION OF THE REVENUE'S INTENDED PURPOSE, IF ANY.

7 (V) (A) ACTUAL EXPENDITURES, INCLUDING ACTUAL SALARY 8 EXPENDITURES AND ACTUAL BENEFIT EXPENDITURES REPORTED BY JOB 9 CATEGORY SPECIFIED IN THE STANDARD CHART OF ACCOUNTS AND 10 INCLUDING AN ITEMIZATION OF EACH EXPENDITURE PAID FOR MARKETING. 11 FOR STUDENT RECRUITMENT, TO A LOBBYIST, A CONTRACTOR, OR AN 12 EDUCATION MANAGEMENT PROVIDER. EACH ITEMIZATION MUST INCLUDE, 13 AT A MINIMUM, THE EXPENDITURE RECIPIENT'S NAME, THE EXPENDITURE 14 AMOUNT, AND A DESCRIPTION OF THE EXPENDITURE'S PURPOSE.

15 (B) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (1)(a.5)(V)(A) OF THIS 16 SECTION, A SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES IS 17 RURAL BASED ON THE GEOGRAPHIC SIZE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE 18 DISTANCE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM THE NEAREST LARGE, 19 URBANIZED AREA, AND THAT ENROLLS FEWER THAN ONE THOUSAND 20 STUDENTS IN KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELFTH GRADE, IS NOT REQUIRED 21 TO REPORT EXPENDITURES AT THE SCHOOL LEVEL EXCEPT FOR SCHOOL 22 LEVEL EXPENDITURES THAT THE SCHOOL DISTRICT CHARGES TO A DISTRICT 23 CHARTER SCHOOL.

(VI) THE FEDERAL FORM 990, 990-EZ, OR 990-PF, OR ANY
ASSOCIATED SCHEDULES THAT THE INSTITUTE, SCHOOL DISTRICT, SCHOOL
DISTRICT SCHOOL, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES, OR CHARTER
SCHOOL FILES, IF ANY.

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(a.7) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2027, AND ON A CONTINUING BASIS
 THEREAFTER, IN ADDITION TO THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS
 ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1)(a.5) OF THIS SECTION, EACH
 SCHOOL DISTRICT, IF REQUIRED PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-32-108.5, SHALL
 POST THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION ON ITS PUBLIC WEBSITE FOR FREE, IN
 A DOWNLOADABLE, ACCESSIBLE, AND SORTABLE FORMAT:

7 (I) A COPY OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S PLAN FOR DISTRIBUTING
8 ADDITIONAL MILL LEVY REVENUE COLLECTED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT;
9 OR

(II) A STATEMENT OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF ADDITIONAL MILL
LEVY REVENUE COLLECTED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR EACH PROPERTY
TAX YEAR, THE AMOUNT DISTRIBUTED TO SUPPORT SPECIFIC STUDENT
POPULATIONS AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 22-32-108.5 (5)(b), AND THE
TOTAL AMOUNT DISTRIBUTED FOR SAID STUDENT POPULATIONS AND ON A
PER-PUPIL BASIS TO EACH CHARTER SCHOOL AND INNOVATION SCHOOL OF
THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, AS A PERCENTAGE AND AS A DOLLAR AMOUNT.

17 (d) (I) Additionally, commencing July 1, 2015, THROUGH THE 18 2026-27 BUDGET YEAR, the institute and each school district, board of 19 cooperative services, and charter school shall post in a format that can be 20 downloaded and sorted IS DOWNLOADABLE, ACCESSIBLE, AND SORTABLE, 21 for free public access, the institute's, school district's, BOCES's, or charter 22 school's actual expenditures, including but not limited to actual salary 23 expenditures and actual benefit expenditures reported by job category 24 specified in the standard chart of accounts, at the institute, school district, 25 and BOCES level and at the school-site level.

26 (III) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(d) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
27 2027.

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(e) (I) Additionally, commencing July 1, 2018, THROUGH THE
 2026-27 BUDGET YEAR, the institute and each school district, board of
 cooperative services, and charter school shall post on its website for free
 public access an easily accessible link to the federal form 990, 990-EZ,
 or 990-PF and any associated schedules that the institute, school district,
 board of cooperative services, or charter school files, if any.

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(II) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(e) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2027.

8 (f) (I) Additionally, commencing July 1, 2018, and on a 9 continuing basis thereafter, THROUGH THE 2026-27 BUDGET YEAR, each 10 school district, if required in section 22-32-108.5, shall:

(1) (A) Post a copy of the school district's plan for distributing the
 additional mill levy revenue collected by the school district; or

13 (II) (B) For the 2018-19 budget year, post a statement of intent to 14 distribute the additional mill levy revenue to the charter schools and 15 innovation schools of the school district on a per-pupil basis and, for the 16 2019-20 budget year and for each budget year thereafter, a statement of 17 the total amount of additional mill levy revenue collected by the school 18 district for each property tax year, the amount distributed to support 19 specific student populations as described in section 22-32-108.5 (5)(b), 20 and the total amount distributed for said student populations and on a 21 per-pupil basis to each charter school and innovation school of the school 22 district, as a percentage and as a dollar amount.

(II) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(f) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2027.
(3) (a) (I) THROUGH THE 2026-27 BUDGET YEAR, the institute and
each school district, board of cooperative services, and charter school
shall update the information specified in subsections (1)(a) to (1)(c) and
subsection (1)(e) of this section within sixty days after the institute's,

1 school district's, BOCES's, or charter school's completion or receipt of the 2 applicable report, statement, or document. The institute and each school 3 district, BOCES, and charter school shall update the information specified 4 in subsection (1)(d) of this section annually by a date specified by the 5 financial policies and procedures advisory committee. Each school district 6 shall update the information specified in subsection (1)(f) of this section 7 within thirty days after the school district board of education adopts a new 8 or updated plan for distribution of additional mill levy revenue or, if the 9 school district distributes the additional mill levy revenue on a per-pupil 10 basis to the charter schools and innovation schools of the school district, 11 within thirty days after the end of each budget year.

12 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (3)(a) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2027. 13 (a.5) THE INSTITUTE, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE SCHOOL 14 DISTRICT AND FOR EACH OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S TRADITIONAL PUBLIC 15 SCHOOLS, EACH BOARD OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES, AND EACH CHARTER 16 SCHOOL SHALL UPDATE THE INFORMATION SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTIONS 17 (1)(a.5)(I), (1)(a.5)(II), (1)(a.5)(III), AND (1)(a.5)(VI) OF THIS SECTION18 WITHIN SIXTY DAYS AFTER THE INSTITUTE'S, SCHOOL DISTRICT'S, BOARD 19 OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES', OR CHARTER SCHOOL'S COMPLETION OR 20 RECEIPT OF THE APPLICABLE DOCUMENT. THE INSTITUTE AND EACH 21 SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES, AND CHARTER 22 SCHOOL SHALL UPDATE THE INFORMATION SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTIONS 23 (1)(a.5)(IV) AND (1)(a.5)(V) OF THIS SECTION ANNUALLY BY A DATE 24 SPECIFIED BY THE FINANCIAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ADVISORY 25 COMMITTEE. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL UPDATE THE INFORMATION 26 SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (1)(a.7) OF THIS SECTION WITHIN THIRTY DAYS 27 AFTER THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION ADOPTS A NEW OR

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UPDATED PLAN FOR DISTRIBUTION OF ADDITIONAL MILL LEVY REVENUE
 OR, IF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT DISTRIBUTES THE ADDITIONAL MILL LEVY
 REVENUE ON A PER-PUPIL BASIS TO THE CHARTER SCHOOLS AND
 INNOVATION SCHOOLS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, WITHIN THIRTY DAYS
 AFTER THE END OF EACH BUDGET YEAR.

6 (4) No later than July 1, 2015, The financial policies and 7 procedures advisory committee of the department shall create a template 8 that the institute and school districts, BOCES, and charter schools must 9 use to post all of the information specified in subsection (1) of this 10 section, including but not limited to the site-level reporting requirements. 11 The template may include both the type of electronic file posted as well 12 as the information to be included in the posting. THE TEMPLATE MUST BE 13 IN AN ACCESSIBLE FORMAT.

(5) In addition to the information required in subsection (1) of this
section, the institute and each school district, TRADITIONAL PUBLIC
SCHOOL, BOCES, and charter school shall provide a link to the
department's website or the location information for the department's
website where a member of the public may access information or reports
that are submitted directly to the department.

20 (6) THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION DO
21 NOT APPLY TO ANY EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAM.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-30.5-104.7,
 amend (2) introductory portion and (2)(d)(III) as follows:

24 22-30.5-104.7. Charter school networks - authority 25 definitions. (2) Notwithstanding any provision of this article ARTICLE
26 30.5 to the contrary, a charter school network:

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(d) Is authorized to make necessary and appropriate expenditures

from any lawful source for central office purposes and to allocate funds
 among the schools that it operates, as permitted by law and consistent
 with the terms of the charter contract. A charter school network:

4 (III) Commencing July 1, 2015, SHALL comply with section
5 22-44-304 (1)(d) SECTION 22-44-304 in reporting expenditures at the local
6 education provider and school-site level.

7 SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 8 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 9 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 10 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 11 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 12 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 13 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 14 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 15 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
