101	CONCERNING THE INAPPLICABILITY OF THE ECONOMIC LOSS RULE TO
102	CERTAIN CLAIMS BROUGHT BY A RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY
103	OWNER AGAINST A CONSTRUCTION PROFESSIONAL.

Bill Summary

The bill clarifies that construction professionals owe an independent tort duty of care to construct residential homes in a non-defective and reasonable manner, and that this duty is owed equally to original and subsequent residential home purchasers.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 13-20-806, add (8)
3	as follows:
4	13-20-806. Limitation of damages. (8) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY
5	PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, A CONSTRUCTION PROFESSIONAL
6	OWES AN INDEPENDENT TORT DUTY TO AN ORIGINAL RESIDENTIAL HOME
7	PURCHASER AND A SUBSEQUENT RESIDENTIAL HOME PURCHASER.
8	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
9	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
10	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
11	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
12	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
13	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
14	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
15	November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
16	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
