A BILL FOR AN ACT

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - Senate Health and Human Services Committee. In 2019, the division of insurance within the department of regulatory agencies (department) established the primary care payment reform collaborative (collaborative) to, among other things, advise in the development of affordability standards and targets for carrier investments in primary care, identify barriers to the adoption of alternative payment

models by health-care providers and insurers, and develop recommendations to address barriers.

The bill implements the recommendations of the department's sunset review and report by:

- Continuing the collaborative for 7 years, until September 1, 2032; and
- Scheduling the next sunset review to take place pursuant to the sunset review structure for advisory committees.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-16-150, **amend**
3 (7) as follows:

4 **10-16-150. Primary care payment reform collaborative -**

6 section is repealed, effective ~~September 1, 2025~~ SEPTEMBER 1, 2032.
7 Before the repeal, the functions of the primary care payment reform
8 collaborative are scheduled for review in accordance with ~~section~~
9 ~~24-34-104~~ SECTION 2-3-1203.

10 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, **add**
11 (23.5)(a)(II) as follows:

12 **2-3-1203. Sunset review of advisory committees - legislative**
13 **declaration - definition - repeal.** (23.5) (a) The following statutory
14 authorizations for the designated advisory committees will repeal on
15 September 1, 2032:

16 (II) THE PRIMARY CARE PAYMENT REFORM COLLABORATIVE
17 CREATED IN SECTION 10-16-150.

18 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, **repeal**
19 (26)(a)(VIII) as follows:

20 **24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies**
21 **and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative**

1 **declaration - repeal.** (26) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both,
2 are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2025:

5 **SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
6 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
7 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
8 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
9 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
10 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
11 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
12 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
13 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
