HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 25-1010 101 CONCERNING RECOGNITION OF MILITARY, VETERANS, AND POW/MIA 102 APPRECIATION DAY. 1 WHEREAS, Colorado has a proud and distinguished history of 2 dedicated military service by men and women whose courage, heroism, 3 and sacrifice preserve the liberties and democratic way of life set forth in 4 our state and federal constitutions; and WHEREAS, Colorado is home to a significant number of military 5 6 installations, including Fort Carson, the United States Air Force 7 Academy, Buckley Space Force Base, Peterson Space Force Base, 8 Schriever Space Force Base, and Cheyenne Mountain Space Force 9 Station, that contribute not only to the national security of our nation but 10 to the economic health of our state; and

1	WHEREAS, Colorado benefits greatly from the presence and
2	military service of the more than 47,000 men and women in our state who
3	serve in the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Space Force, Marine
4	Corps, and Coast Guard; the branch Reserves; the Colorado National
5	Guard; and the Civil Air Patrol; and
6	WHEREAS, The service members of the Colorado National Guard
7	have served in defense of our nation and as the first military responders
8	in support of civil authorities during domestic emergencies and are
9	celebrating their 165th anniversary this year; and
10	WHEREAS, In addition to active members of the United States
11	Armed Services, Colorado is the proud home of more than 340,000
12	military veterans who have served their country long and well and who
13	bring great honor and distinction to the state. Colorado is home not only
14	to active duty service personnel and veterans but also to the countless
15	family members of these service members who display the same
16	dedication, courage, and sacrifice; and
17	WHEREAS, We should never forget the uncommon sacrifices
18	made for us by the service members from Colorado declared missing in
19	action or prisoners of war while defending the principles of liberty and
20	justice in conflicts around the world; and
21	WHEREAS, Disparate and diverse groups of Coloradans, such as
22	persons who are African American, Native American, Latino or Latina,
23	or Hispanic, in addition to men and women of all backgrounds, are bound
24	together in the Armed Services by their selfless dedication to the spirit of
25	our nation, the ideals of freedom and democracy, and the cause of
26	democracy and stability around the globe; and
27	WHEREAS, In this time of conflict, it is particularly appropriate
28	to recognize the Coloradans in all branches and components of the Armed
29	Services who serve to protect the security and peace of our nation and
30	other nations; now, therefore,
31	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-fifth
32	General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:
33	(1) That we, the members of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly,
34	hereby extend our heartfelt gratitude to our state's veterans, past and
35	present, to all members of the military currently serving in the Armed

Services, and to the family members of active duty personnel and veterans, and that we remember and honor prisoners of war and those missing in action from previous conflicts;

- (2) That we express our continued partnership with and support of Fort Carson and maintain our strong commitment to supporting ongoing military training at the Mountain Post; and
- (3) That we encourage the citizens of Colorado to join in the celebration of Colorado's Military, Veterans, and POW/MIA Appreciation Day, in recognition and honor of the thousands of fellow citizens in the military who protect and serve their communities, state, and country.

Laura Clellan, Adjutant General of Colorado, Executive Director of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs; Carol Thomas, Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Colorado; the American Legion of Colorado; the Colorado Board of Veterans Affairs; the United Veterans Coalition of Colorado; the Paralyzed Veterans of America Mountain States Chapter; the Broomfield Veterans Museum; the Wings Over the Rockies Air and Space Museum; and each member of Colorado's Congressional delegation.
