HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 25-1012 CONCERNING THE FIFTY-SEVENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CAPTURE OF	
THE U.S.S. PUEBLO BY NORTH KOREA.	
WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Pueblo was originally launched as a	
United States Army cargo ship in 1944 but was transferred to the United	
States Navy and renamed the U.S.S. Pueblo in 1966; and	
WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Pueblo was named for the city of Pueblo,	
Colorado, and the county of Pueblo, Colorado, and was the third ship in	
the naval fleet to bear the name Pueblo; and	
WHEREAS, After leaving Japan in early January 1968 on an	
intelligence mission, the U.S.S. Pueblo was attacked by the North Korean	
military on January 23, 1968; and	

1	WHEREAS, According to United States naval authorities and the
2	crew of the U.S.S. Pueblo, the ship was in international waters at the time
3	of the attack; and
4	WHEREAS, Navy Fireman Duane Hodges of the U.S.S. Pueblo
5	was killed during the attack, and 80 crew members and two civilian
6	oceanographers were captured and held for 11 months by the North
7	Korean government; and
8	WHEREAS, This year marks the fifty-seventh anniversary of
9	North Korea's attack on the U.S.S. Pueblo and her crew; and
10	WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Pueblo is still in commission in the
l 1	United States Navy but continues to be held by the North Korean
12	government and is currently in a museum in Pyongyang, North Korea;
13	now, therefore,
14	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-fifth
15	General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:
16	(1) That we, the members of the General Assembly, recognize the
17	bravery and sacrifice of the crew of the U.S.S. Pueblo;
18	(2) That we take pride in the fact that the U.S.S. Pueblo bears the
19	name of a city and a county in Colorado, and, therefore, the citizens of
20	Colorado should be aware of the incident that occurred with the U.S.S.
21	Pueblo 57 years ago;
22	(3) That we continue the call for Kim Jong Un and the North
23	Korean government to return the U.S.S. Pueblo to the people of the
24	United States; and
25	(4) That we designate January 23 of each year as "U.S.S. Pueblo
26	Day", a day to remember and honor the brave crew of the U.S.S. Pueblo.
27	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent
28	to President Donald J.Trump; Governor Jared Polis; and the members of
9	Colorado's Congressional delegation.
