SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 25-007

101 **CONCERNING PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 14 AS "COLORADO READ TO**
102 **YOUR CHILD DAY".**

1 WHEREAS, The most important activity for setting the foundation
2 for future literacy success is reading aloud to children; and

3 WHEREAS, Strong literacy skills are essential for the
4 development and growth of a community and our nation, and the ability
5 to read by third grade is critical to a child's ability to learn in the future;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, Children who struggle with literacy are more likely
8 to eventually drop out of school without earning their high school
9 diploma, have poor health, and struggle to acquire a living wage as an
10 adult; and

11 WHEREAS, A child's early years play a pivotal role in literacy, as

1 90% of a child's brain has developed by age five, and skills learned
2 between birth and age five predict literacy in later years; and

3 WHEREAS, Children who struggle with literacy in kindergarten
4 through third grade are unlikely to catch up to their peers; and

5 WHEREAS, When children are read to aloud from birth, they are
6 exposed to significantly more words in their early years, improving their
7 vocabulary, comprehension and literacy skills, and increasing overall
8 brain development; and

9 WHEREAS, Children who experience this early exposure to books
10 and have access to home libraries develop stronger language skills by the
11 time they start school and are more likely to develop a lasting interest in
12 reading and learning; and

13 WHEREAS, When caregivers or loved ones read to children
14 regularly, they build nurturing bonds that are vital for the child's cognitive
15 and social-emotional health. Reading together provides positive attention
16 from caring adults and creates a sense of security, while reducing stress
17 and the negative impacts of adverse childhood experiences; and

18 WHEREAS, More than 30 years of research demonstrates that
19 reading aloud to a child accelerates development and boosts overall
20 kindergarten readiness. Evidence also indicates that when children enter
21 school with the developmental skills and foundation to succeed, the
22 results of this early intervention last a lifetime; now, therefore,

23 *Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-fifth General Assembly*
24 *of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:*

25 That we, the members of the General Assembly, declare the state's
26 commitment to birth-to-age-five early literacy by acknowledging
27 February 14, 2025, as "Colorado Read to Your Child Day" in alignment
28 with "National Read to Your Child Day".

29 *Be It Further Resolved*, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent
30 to the Reach Out and Read Colorado and Imagination Library of
31 Colorado organizations.
