Summary Information

Overview. The bill authorizes the Department of Local Affairs to hire a third-party contractor to administer a homelessness program.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, the Division of Housing in the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) must operate a program serving persons experiencing homelessness. The bill allows DOLA to hire a third-party contractor to administer the program on its behalf.

State Expenditures

Although the bill has no impact on overall funding for the homelessness program, administrative expenses may change, with increased costs for contract administration and oversight and reduced internal program administration costs in DOLA. To the extent administrative costs increase, funding available for grants and services will correspondingly decrease.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
