## Summary of Legislation

---

The bill allows local collaborative management programs (CMPs) to enter into agreements with any Medicaid managed care entities (MCE). The bill also specifies that courts may access relevant program records, and removes obsolete language.

## Background

---

The Collaborative Management Program was established by [HB 04-1451](#) to coordinate services provided by counties and the state to children and families that use several government services. It is administered by the CDHS in [partnership with several local and state agencies](#).

## State and Local Expenditures

---

The bill may minimally increase workload to local CMPs to draft agreements for any additional MCEs that participate in the program and for CDHS to oversee their participation. Because some MCEs already participate in CMPs, any increase in workload is expected to be minimal.

## Effective Date

---

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
