Summary Information

Overview. The bill allows local governments to impose installation or operational requirements for an electronic fence detection system.

Summary of Legislation

The bill permits local governments to impose installation or operational requirements for an electronic fence detection system consistent with requirements for other alarm system. This includes requiring permits and inspections.

Local Government

To the extent local governments choose to impose requirements, permits, and/or inspections, revenue, expenditure, and/or workload may increase. The exact impact will depend on the regulations adopted by the local jurisdiction.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
