

HB 25-1102: REPEAL NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE COMPACT

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Fiscal note status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill

Summary Information

Overview. The bill removes Colorado from the interstate compact to elect the president by national popular vote.

Types of impacts. The bill has no fiscal impact on state or local governments.

Appropriations. No appropriation is required.

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Summary of Legislation

Under current law, Colorado is a member of an interstate compact to elect the president by national popular vote once states with the majority of electoral votes ratify the agreement. Under the compact, presidential electors in Colorado are bound to support the winner of the national popular vote once it takes effect. This bill removes Colorado from the interstate compact.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

This bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact. The Secretary of State is responsible for certifying presidential electors and this bill does not change the process by which this is done. Therefore, the bill does not affect the revenue, workload or expenditures of any state or local government entity.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
