## HB 25-1229: SALARIES OF ELECTED LOCAL OFFICIALS

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### Summary Information

**Overview.** The bill allows elected county officers to choose to receive a salary of any amount lower than the amount set by law, and also changes the county classification of Mesa County beginning in 2029.

**Types of impacts.** The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

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## Summary of Legislation

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The bill allows a district attorney and elected county officers to elect to receive a salary lower than the amount set by law or to not receive a salary, as long as the county treasurer is notified at least 30 days before the next fiscal year. Under current law, elected county officials in certain counties may only elect to receive a salary that is 50 percent lower than the salary amount set by law.

The bill also changes Mesa County's categorization from I-D to I-A beginning January 1, 2029, which increases the salaries for Mesa County's elected officials.

## Local Government

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The bill increases expenditures for Mesa County beginning January 1, 2029, for salaries for the designated officials whose salary is set by law. For all counties, the bill may affect expenditures if elected county officials elect to receive a smaller salary or no salary.

## Effective Date

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The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
