SUBJECT Department of Early Childhood Comeback – Universal Preschool Funding

This is the same as the memo that was distributed Friday, 3/17/23, except that the table includes a new column for the March OSPB forecast adjusted to assume a decrease in the tobacco tax rates, as required by TABOR.

The JBC's actions to date on funding for the universal preschool program would provide:

- Sufficient funding to cover all populations contemplated in the enabling legislation plus 15 hours of preschool (rather than 10 hours) for children in the year prior to kindergarten, assuming 30,000 of these children enroll.
- Maintain an uncommitted balance in the Preschool Programs Cash Fund as a reserve/contingency equal to 10 percent of the projected expenditures. The reserve/contingency is to address forecast error regarding either the revenues or expenditures, but the biggest uncertainty is related to the number of children who will enroll. If more than 30,000 children enroll, the reserve/contingency would allow the Department to serve the additional children without needing to reduce the 15 hours mid-year. Actual enrollment to date of children in the year prior to kindergarten is 28,860.

The JBC's actions were based on the December Legislative Council Staff forecast of revenue to Preschool Programs Cash Fund. The March forecast suggests there will be more revenue from Proposition EE, reducing the General Fund needed to achieve a 10 percent reserve/contingency in the Preschool Programs Cash Fund.

BILL TOPIC: Colorado Universal Preschool Program Funding

A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING FUNDING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EARLY CHILDHOOD
102 FOR THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov/.)

Joint Budget Committee. Current law requires the general assembly to transfer money to the preschool programs cash fund from the general fund or the state education fund in the 2023-24 and 2024-25 fiscal years. Beginning in the 2024-25 fiscal year, the amount transferred is required to increase by the rate of inflation.

The bill repeals those requirements and instead requires the

general assembly to appropriate money to the department of early childhood from the general fund for the 2023-24 fiscal year for purposes of the Colorado universal preschool program. Beginning in the 2024-25 fiscal year, and each year thereafter, the amount appropriated must increase annually by the rate of inflation.

- SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26.5-4-209, amend
 (1) as follows:

26.5-4-209. Preschool programs cash fund - created - use.

(1) (a) The preschool programs cash fund is hereby created in the state treasury. The fund consists of money credited to the fund pursuant to section 24-22-118 (2), money transferred to the fund pursuant to section 39-28-116 (6), money annually transferred to the fund as provided in subsection (1)(b) of this section, and any additional money the general assembly may appropriate or transfer to the fund. The state treasurer shall credit all interest and income derived from the deposit and investment of money in the preschool programs cash fund to the fund. The general assembly shall annually appropriate money in the preschool programs cash fund to the department to implement the preschool program.

(b) (I) For the 2023-24 fiscal year, the general assembly shall transfer to the preschool programs cash fund from the general fund or the state education fund created in section 17 of article IX of the state constitution an amount equal to the difference between the amount of the state share of total program calculated pursuant to article 54 of title 22 for the 2022-23 budget year, after application of the budget stabilization factor and after any mid-year adjustment, and the amount that the state share of total program, after application of the budget stabilization factor and after any mid-year adjustment, would be for the 2022-23 budget year if—calculated—without—including—the—statewide—preschool—program enrollment, as defined in section 22-54-103, for the 2022-23 budget year

and the number of three- and four-year-old pupils with disabilities
receiving an educational program under the "Exceptional Children's
Educational Act", article 20 of title 22, for the 2022-23 budget year.

(II) For the 2024-25 fiscal year and for each fiscal year thereafter, the general assembly shall annually transfer to the preschool programs eash fund from the general fund or the state education fund created in section 17 of article IX of the state constitution an amount equal to the amount described in subsection (1)(b)(I) of this section increased annually, beginning in the 2024-25 fiscal year, by the rate of inflation.

SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
