	allowed a month. Because of that, he went through an intensely traumatic month of trialing new meds the process was rushed
	because we knew we only had 4 weeks. Needless to say, we were
	unable to learn anything from the stay, and he ended up worse. A year
	later, we were left having to call the emergency room every time he
	went into crisis. There are absolutely no programs in our state that
	will service this population. Our son had two seizures in the ER
	both induced by excess amounts of Ketamine that the EMTs
	administered to sedate him. We went to Porter Hospital ER, Denver
	Health no mental health programs at all, let alone any supports for a
	teen/adult with acuity issues (because he is non-verbal the assumption
	is he couldn't be treated in-patient). CO has a significant issue both
	in terms of the quality/quantity of mental health services, but also
	access. By providing a voucher system for families in need staff is
	confident that they will be paid for their services, and families can
	access a great number of providers beyond what's covered under
	Medicaid programs.
KRISTEN BARA	I oppose HB23-1200. This is yet another fiscally irresponsible
Against	program to band-aid the mental health crisis you've created due to
themself	poor covid-policy and lockdowns. These lockdowns have increased
	our rates of depression, suicide, domestic abuse, and drug overdose.
	As a former mental health professional who was illegally fired for her

	medical privacy violated by her employer to keep her job, I have
	since struggled mentally, physically, and financially from the actions
	of Governor Polis and your failure as my legislators to protect us.
