The record shall be confidential and shall remain confidential after filing with 9 the supreme court. A recommendation of the commission for the removal 10 11 or retirement of a justice or judge shall not be confidential after it is filed 12 with the supreme court.

SECTION 9. In Colorado Revised Statutes, repeal 24-72-402 as
 follows:

15 24-72-402. Violation - penalty. Any member of the commission, 16 any master appointed by the supreme court, or anyone providing assistance to such commission or such masters who willfully and 17 knowingly discloses the contents of any paper filed with, or any 18 19 proceeding before, such commission or such masters, or willfully and knowingly discloses the contents of any recommendation of the 20 21 commission before such recommendation is filed with the supreme court is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be 22 23 punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars. This section 24 shall not apply to any necessary communication between the members of the commission or the masters appointed by the supreme court or anyone 25 employed to aid such commission or such masters in the filing or 26 27 documentation of any paper filed with, or any proceedings before, such 28 commission or such masters or the preparation of the recommendation of 29 such commission.

30 SECTION 10. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-1301, amend
