### Nonprofit Economic Impact (2017)

23,147 nonprofits in Colorado statewide

\$40 billion in economic impact

11.3% of overall GDP

189,600 jobs in Colorado directly & indirectly


5% of Colorado's workforce




### COLORADO NONPROFITS IN DEPTH

#### FINANCIAL HEALTH

Nonprofits suffered from the disruption of their programs and funding in 2020:12

57% decreased overall expenses in 2020

64% suspended or paused services at some point in 2020

44% reduced the number of programs or services

47% served fewer people by the end of the year

#### Charitable giving


- \$471.4 billion
- 3.8% increase over 2019
- Personal income grew by 6.1%
- Individual giving decreased by nearly 0.8% without MacKenzie Scott's gift

#### **Donors**

- Many donors shifted their pandemic-related causes
- 1.3% increase in 2020 ov
- 11% increase in small do (\$101-\$500)
- 14% decline in # househort to charity between 2002-2 particularly small & mid-s


#### **U.S. Nonprofit Sector Jobs**

- 12.5 million employees
- 3rd largest workforce behind retail and hospitality
- 1.64 million jobs lost March to May 2020 (13%)
- 557,000 (33%) of these jobs have not been recove

#### Colorado's job losses


- -24,500 jobs if 13% of nonprofit job were lost in C
- 8,100 nonprofit workers still not employed if 33% jobs have not been recovered

### Federal COVID-19 relief for nonprofit sector

- Nonprofits received 4% of PPP loans (Grand Valley S University study)
  - Saved 4.1 million jobs
  - Larger share of loans over \$150,000
  - Nonprofits with 500+ employees mostly did not qualify
- Advocacy to continue Employee Retention Tax Credit
  - All-volunteer nonprofits ineligible for many relief programs
- 50 to 75 percent federal payments to nonprofits that reimburse states for unemployment benefits expired in September



### State COVID-19 relief for nonprofit sector

- Grants and forgivable loans are favored forms of assist
- Governor's COVID-19 relief fund provided over \$16 m funds raised by donors and foundation but it expired in
- Receipt of support via CLIMBER, the Gap Fund, and state programs probably limited but more data needed
- Request submitted to Governor Polis for \$50 million of funds to provide grants to over 1,600 nonprofit organized



## **ARPA** and Local Relief

- ARPA allows use of state and local funds for assis to nonprofits
- Opportunities for nonprofits to
  - partner on community priorities
  - advocate for small business/nonprofit relief
  - advocate for inclusion of people served in public discussions of ARPA funds
  - establish or strengthen relationships with local e officials



## **ARPA** and Local Relief

- Nonprofits have to advocate (not apply) for available these funds to support their missions or workforces
- We encourage local governments to include supporting the work of local nonprofits serving the same consas local governments
