Today I am writing on behalf of our mission-focused business entity, Gary Ventures, to support HB23 -1223 Task Force To Prioritize Grants Target Population sponsored by Representative Jennifer Bacon and Representative Regina English.

Dramatically decreasing youth suicide, youth violence, and risky behaviors are issues we care about deeply at Gary. We know that youth mental health is at a record low across the nation, including in Colorado. We further know that many youth, in particular those from lower-income backgrounds, can thrive with greater access to meaningful out-of-school activities that can reduce youth violence and risky behavior. Gary has been committed to working on improving youth outcomes with our partners and community for many years. Gary envisions a world where every youth has a strong sense of purpose and path that buffer them from negative outcomes.

The Task Force established under HB23-1223 is created to focus on good data and outcomes in order to prioritize future spending on this important work.
