themself	I live in Boulder County and nearly every week I hike our beautiful Ponderosa foothills trails. While some are quiet and peaceful, others are interrupted by people discharging firearms. Just last week the crows and jays were racing away overhead as people were firing rifles on our hike to Polly's Cabin near Nederland. During these hikes, there is a moment when I need to decide if I should turn around and flee, or if someone is shooting at tin cans in their backyard and I am in the line of fire.

	Today, guns are everywhere in Colorado. Our state ranks worse than the national average (12.2 gun deaths per 100k residents) for gun violence. Colorado is at 17.8 gun deaths per 100k Colorado residents. Discharging firearms in densely populated areas contributes to this sad statistic, and is not limited to urban areas. I support HB23-1165. County commissioners need the best tools to take action to limit gun use in populated areas and basing decisions on the number of dwellings will be much more precise and consistent than guessing the number of people living in an area. I encourage the committee to vote YES on HB23-1165-County Authority to Prevent Firearm Discharge. Thank you.
